In the 19th Century, Ronda was an essential part of romantic English travelers' "Great South Tour". Among these was Queen Victoria's celebrated Prime Minister, Benjamin Disraeli. This elegant wine is a tribute to those Englishmen who, through their accounts and sketches, gave this beautiful Andalusian city universal character.

Designation of Origin: Sierras de Málaga. Sub-zone: Serranía de Ronda.

Varietals: Cabernet Sauvignon (30%), Garnacha (25%), Tempranillo (25%), Syrah (10%), Merlot (10%).

Harvest: Selected, hand-picked grapes from vineyards located at heights of 600-900 m.

Winemaking: Fermented on the skins, with medium maceration, at a controlled temperature of 25°C.

Graduation: 14.5% vol.

Total acidity: 3.20 g/l (t.a.).

Volatile acidity: 0.60 g/l (s.a.).

Residual sugar: 0 g/l.

Free SO₂: 25 mg/l

Total SO₂: 82 mg/l

Type of bottle: Borgogne, green, 75cl.

Tasting note: Lively, deep, cherry red tones, with some violet notes. Aromas of red fruits, with some hints of wild herbs and an intense minerality. In the mouth it is fresh, fleshy and enveloping. A very nice wine.
